Here lies Liske Richert geboren Funcken. Died in the year 1769 at the age of 68 years GRanDMA 33032

After many different photos of this stone, John D Richert was able to make out enough letters and numbers so we could make a conclusion. Elisabeth (Funck) Richert, died 1769 (GMA#33032).



This one is fairly easy to read. Hans Unrau's frau, Ancke, died 1782 (GMA#32103).



This stone was found many years ago by Darrel and Judy Unruh while on the Peter J Klassen tour of Poland. It was found in the vicinity of the Przechowka but we don't know where exactly. It was moved to the Heubuden cemetery since they were unsure at the time of the exact location of the Przechowka cemetery. It is still at Heubuden today. Should it be returned to Przechowka?

Tobias Sparling, died 1 May 1751 (GMA#53738).



Jann Richert, died 9 Sept 1749 GRanDMA #48247 from Mennonite house in Chrystkowo

Stone located at the 1791 Chata Mennonicka in Chrystkowo. Likely from Przechowka. Jann Richert died 1749 (GMA#48247).



Efcke geboren Ratzlaffen from the Mennonite house in Chrystkowo

Stone located at the 1791 Chata Mennonicka in Chrystkowo. Likely from Przechowka. "Efcke geboren Ratzlaffen". Not enough information to make a determination about identity but obviously very old.



Stone with inscription that appears to say "H $\,$ U".



A stone with an inscription that might be deciphered someday. To my eye it might say "1751" on the top line, middle line might say "Decker" or "Becker".



Stone with a painted inscription



This stone is likely from the era after the Mennonites left.
